- GEOGRAPHY - Use different types of maps (political, physical, and thematic) to identify map elements; using maps and globes, locate the student's hometown, Florida, and North America, and locate the state capital and the national capital; label on a map or globe the continents, oceans, Equator, Prime Meridian, North and South Pole; use a map to locate the countries in North America.
- ECONOMICS - recognize that people make choices because of limited resources and that people supply goods and services based on consumer demands.
- CIVICS AND GOVERNMENT - explain why people form governments, explain the consequences of an absence of rules and laws, identify what it means to be a

United States citizen either by birth or by naturalization, define and apply the characteristics of responsible citizenship, understand the function, powers, and limits of American government and recognize symbols, individuals, events, and documents that represent the United States.
